CHARITY WEEK CELEBRATION**



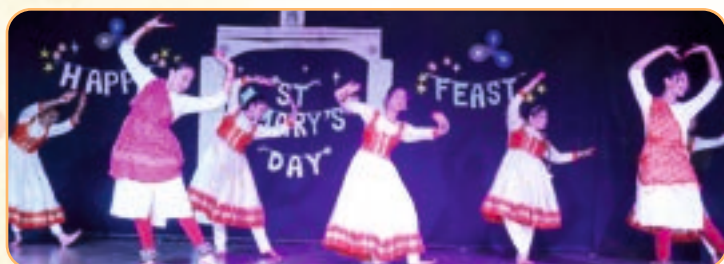

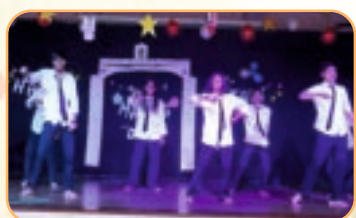
Navrang was indeed a grand celebration of knowledge, creativity and multidisciplinary excellence.

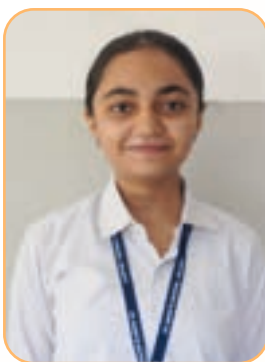
It was an intellectually stimulating and thoroughly enjoyable celebration of knowledge and brilliance.

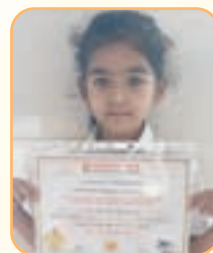

won't sleep.

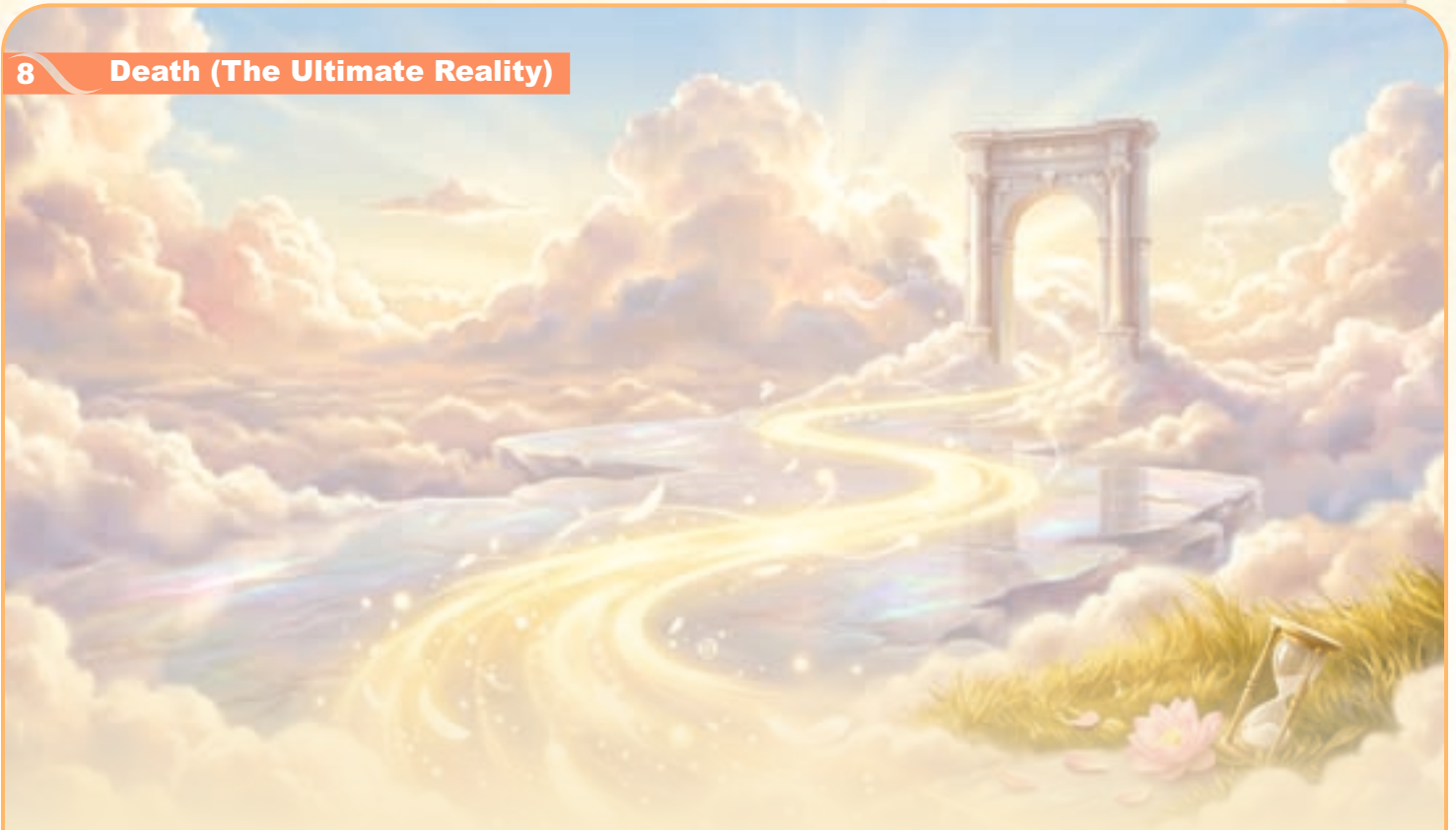
